
MOATEP is affiliated by the American Montessori Society, accredited by the Montessori Accreditation Council for Teacher Education (MACTE) and certified by the Oregon Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC). Successful completion of the program results in an AMS Infant & Toddler Teaching Credential or an AMS Early Childhood Teaching Credential.

You have two options for completing your credential – a one-year option or a two-year option. Our 2020 cohort of adult learners will begin their academic phase June 2020. Following the completion of your academic phase you will begin your nine-month Practicum/student teaching phase beginning the fall of 2020 (for the one year program) or the fall of 2021 (for the two-year program). The successful adult learner concludes with their AMS Montessori Teaching credential in June 2021 (one-year program) or June 2022 (two-year program). This application serves as a reference for you in completing your application for the American Montessori Society’s credential. Please read through it thoroughly.

Credentials Offered

Montessori of Alameda Teacher Education Program (MOATEP) offers the following four credentials:

INFANT & TODDLER (BIRTH THROUGH 3-YEAR OLDS)

- ***American Montessori Society's (AMS) Infant & Toddler Credential*** for adults with a Bachelor's Degree from an accredited 4-year college; this credential is also awarded to students educated overseas if a credential evaluation finds his/her qualifications equivalent to a 4-year degree from an accredited institution within the US.
- ***American Montessori Society's (AMS) Associate Infant & Toddler Credential*** for non-college graduates. Associate Credential candidates are responsible for verifying local regulations to determine qualifications for employment. Associate Credential candidates are required to sign a statement verifying that they understand that some locations or schools may not accept an Associate credential as the qualification for full teaching responsibility. AMS strongly encourages holders of the Associate Credential to obtain a bachelor's degree within 7 years of credentialing.

EARLY CHILDHOOD (AGES 2.5 THROUGH 6-YEAR OLDS)

- ***American Montessori Society's (AMS) Early Childhood Credential*** for adults with a Bachelor's Degree from an accredited 4-year college; this credential is also awarded to students educated overseas if a credential evaluation finds his/her qualifications equivalent to a 4-year degree from an accredited institution within the US.
- ***American Montessori Society's (AMS) Associate Early Childhood Credential*** for non-college graduates. Associate Credential candidates are responsible for verifying local regulations to determine qualifications for employment. Associate Credential candidates are required to sign a statement verifying that they understand that some locations or schools may not accept an Associate credential as the qualification for full teaching responsibility. AMS strongly encourages holders of the Associate Credential to obtain a bachelor's degree within 7 years of credentialing.

Admissions Process

As long as there are openings remaining, applications for enrollment are accepted at any time prior to two weeks before the first day of classes. Following the completion and receipt of the application and application fee, the following items are required to be submitted for the full application to be considered complete:

1. Official Transcript
 - a. Transcript for B.A. or B.S. degree, or higher. (Evaluation by a NACES member service is required of degrees granted outside the United States.*)
 - b. OR a high school or GED diploma (for AMS Associate Credential)
2. Three professional letters of recommendation (preferably a combination of academic and professional)
3. Personal statement of purpose for attending the Montessori Teaching Credential program

Based upon the documents submitted and the discussions with the applicant, MOATEP determines the applicant's ability to benefit from the course, commitment to the profession, academic preparation, and feasibility of successful completion. MOATEP will notify the applicant their admission decision of the final submission of all required admissions documents.

**Applicants that do not have a high school diploma or credential from a regionally accredited US College/University must submit a transcript to a recognized US credentialing agency (e.g. a credentialing agency that is a member of NACES – the National Association of Credential Evaluation Services) for credit equivalency evaluation. If the evaluation determines the non-US transcript to be equivalent to a bachelor's degree or higher in the US, the adult learner will then be eligible for an AMS credential upon successful completion. If the evaluation determines that the non-US transcript is not the equivalent of a bachelor's degree or higher, then an Associate credential will be awarded. If English is not the applicant's first language, a Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) may also be required.*

Program Overview

The **Infant & Toddler** and **Early Childhood** Credential programs consist of three parts:

1. Montessori Foundation Preparation
2. Academic Phase
3. Student Teaching Phase (known as the Practicum)

	Scheduling explanation	Description
Montessori Foundation Preparation	Self-paced The requirement of this segment of the program will be provided to students upon acceptance to the program. Students may proceed through the material at their own pace, but all requirements must be fulfilled prior to the start of the Academic phase. Completion time is estimated between 15-20 hours.	The Montessori Foundation Preparation is designed to provide students an opportunity to prepare themselves for the teacher education experience at MOATEP. This ensures that all students arrive at MOATEP having read and studied the same introductory material and having had the same important pre-requisite experiences. This establishes a baseline for the incoming class and provides students a skeletal framework for understanding Montessori theory and philosophy, upon which they may build.
Academic Phase	One Year Program consists of summer intensive academic weeks: 6 weeks for Early Childhood, 5 weeks for Infant & Toddler. Two Year Program consists of 3 summer intensive academic weeks followed by several seminars throughout the following school year.	The academics portion is a rigorous, classroom intensive program. This period of study includes lectures, demonstrations, discussions, workshops and practice/lab sessions. Adult learners will develop detailed manuals of lesson plans in each curriculum area and practice individual lesson presentations. This is a demanding and highly rewarding segment of the MOATEP program.
Practicum Year	Minimum 3 hours/day, 5 mornings/week for the duration of the 9-month academic year <i>(On-site evaluation visits by Field Consultants will be required for candidates engaged in a Supervised Practicum: 3 for Early Childhood and 4 for Infant & Toddler. 5 on-site evaluation visits may be required for those involved in a self-directed Practicum.)</i>	The student teaching Practicum provides students a real-world classroom experience under the direct supervision of a qualified Montessori educator at a qualified and accredited Montessori school. Alongside this Practicum, adult learners gather several times during the year to refresh and gain new skills and to come together to discuss the practical applications of what they have learned in their classroom setting.

Schedule of Tuition, Fees and Other Charges

Tuition: (includes first year AMS and MACTE fees) \$6,850 (Infant & Toddler), \$7,650 (Early Childhood)
Application fee (on or before 4/15/20) \$250 (non-refundable)

Application fee (after 4/15/20) \$350 (non-refundable)
Self-Directed Practicum fee (if no Supervising Teacher) \$300
Continuum fee (if coursework not completed by deadline) \$400 (annually)
Each Practicum visit (beyond the three required) \$120

- For Practicum sites that are outside of a 100-mile radius from MOATEP, the cost of transportation and lodging (if required) must be assumed by the adult learner.
- Tuition payment options are available.
- Fees do not include required books and supplies estimated to cost approximately \$500.
- American Montessori Society offers Teacher Education Scholarships for enrolled adult learners. Visit www.amshq.org for more details. The deadline is May 1st.

Location

All lectures, demonstrations, and practice sessions will be held at the Montessori of Alameda campus at 4210 NE Going Street, Portland, Oregon, 97218. A map of the campus will be provided at orientation.

Transfer Credit

Typically, the entire sequence of curriculum components is required to successfully complete the Montessori Teacher Credential program. However, transfer of course work is permitted when the course work has been successfully completed at a MACTE accredited Teacher Education program. Documentation is required from the previous institution along with the particular courses completed. Experience is not recognized as parallel to the course work. There is no maximum on the quantity of credits that may be transferred from a MACTE accredited Teacher Education Program. As required by AMS, MOATEP will contact the original program to determine if the adult learner is in good standing, including fulfillment of financial obligations.

Housing

MOATEP has adult learners from out of town who require housing during the summer sessions and monthly weekend meetings. Housing is not available through MOATEP. While we do not arrange housing, a list is made available for those that may need it. If you are in need of housing, or if you are a local student interested in hosting an out of town student, please contact the MOATEP Training Director.

Admission for Montessori Teaching Candidate

AMS grants the AMS Associate Infant Toddler and Associate Early Childhood Credential when the course graduate has a high school diploma or GED, but not a bachelor’s degree. Country, state and local employment requirements vary widely and change periodically. In addition, employment requirements vary in different types of schools (e.g. private, public/charter, faith based, publically funded). In some locations or schools, an Associate Credential may not qualify for full teaching responsibility.

Even if it is currently possible to qualify for a full teaching responsibility without a bachelor’s degree, employment regulations may change in the future. The applicant is responsible for checking specific jurisdictions and schools for particular employment requirements.

Applicants for this AMS Montessori Teaching Credential course who do not have a U.S. Bachelor’s degree from a regionally accredited U.S. college/university, or its equivalent are required to sign a statement verifying that they have received the above information before they are considered for acceptance into this course.

AMS strongly encourages holders of the Associate Credential to obtain a bachelor’s degree within 7 years of credentialing. AMS hopes you consider your credential as the beginning of your journey of lifelong learning.
